extra cost options

The charge associated with the provision of these activities covers the cost of providing the service or running the activity

- **Bus Fares for SWIT / WPL program / Local Careers Expo / Independent Living Program/ Bus Training/Physical Education Program/Community Access**

Cost may be a maximum of \$2 per bus trip (up to a maximum of \$20 per week). Students will have kept their SmartRider Card from the Library and can top up this card or pay driver direct.

Maximum Yearly Cost

- **Independent Living/Life Skills Program/Healthy Eating**

Cost may be a maximum of \$5 per week. Community outings – e.g. bus timetable familiarisation, shopping, cooking, healthy eating etc. Students will use money directly with shops, bus companies, etc.
